"Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." (Luke 2:15)



When Vicky asked me to prepare a reflection for Christmas, she suggested Luke 2:1-20. The Bible I use for prayer is "*The Message*" by Eugene Peterson, which mostly has a different way of saying things, so I picked it up and was drawn to these words of the shepherds:
